RESOURCE FOR PARENTS: MOCK UNIVERSITY INTERVIEW – PRACTICE AT HOME

Set Up - Before The Interview

- ✓ Try to make it real both dress up in smart clothing.
- ✓ Parents collect your child/candidate from the 'waiting room' this could be the hall, the living room...
- Create a realistic setting set up a realistic interview environment with a table and chairs, a glass of water for your candidate. A dining table or desk would be perfect.

Questions to ask your child/candidate:

- 1) What do you enjoy most about school? What do you not like?
- 2) What do you think is your biggest strength? What do you think is your biggest weakness?
- 3) Why did you choose your A Level/BTEC subjects?
- 4) Why do you want to go to this university?
- 5) Why do you want to study this subject?
- 6) Tell me about a time when worked in a team. What role did you play?
- 7) Tell me about a time when you worked under pressure. How did you cope during that time?
- 8) Tell me about a time when you have held a position of responsibility. How did you stay organised?

Interview Top Tips For Your Child

- Encourage your child to prepare example answers to questions
- If they are unsure of the question, or would like a little more thinking time, suggest that they ask you to repeat the question
- Body language encourage them to maintain eye contact and take a deep breath to calm any nerves
- Suggest that they prepare a question for you as the interviewer it shows initiative and enthusiasm. Give them a couple of ideas:

⇒What sort of societies or sports clubs are there to get involved in?

⇒A question for a professor – why did you decide to work here?

Follow up post interview – give your child some brief feedback, including what they did well. Two pieces of feedback should be sufficient!

FIVE TIPS FOR WELLBEING

1. The Bigger Picture:

Try to Keep the 'Bigger Picture' in Mind. Remember your long term Targets and Aspirations.

2. Be Active:

Regular exercise can help raise selfesteem, help sleep, improve memory and concentration.

3. Relax:

Regular Relaxation is great for your Wellbeing: Ensure that you find time each day to relax.

4. Get Quality Sleep:

Individual's needs vary, but most people feel they need 7-8 hours, whilst others feel they need 9-10 hours a night.

5. Connect:

• Evidence indicates feeling close to other people is a fundamental human need. Social relationships are critical for promoting wellbeing.





What is an apprenticeship?

It's a real job, with hands-on experience, a salary and the chance to train while you work.

Apprenticeships combine practical training in a job with off-the-job learning. This means you can earn money while you gain the skills and knowledge needed for your career.

Apprenticeships are:

- Available in hundreds of different job roles in all sorts of industries and organisations.
- Open to all age groups (above 16 years), whether you are just leaving school and looking to get on the job ladder, have been working for a few years or are looking to start a new career.
- Take between one and six years to complete depending on the type of apprenticeship, the level they are at and your previous experience.

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ucfb means-tested bursaries

Studying for a degree and particularly living away from home can be an expensive experience for applicants, particularly applicants living in London or from low-income and disadvantaged backgrounds.

The Means Tested Bursary is intended to help level the playing field for students from lower income and disadvantaged backgrounds and to ensure that higher education is available to everyone.

Assessments will be made based on your household income, expected accommodation/travel costs and the expected amount of tuition fee loan you would be eligible for as well as based on a range of contextual factors with awards prioritised from disadvantaged or underrepresented backgrounds.

The Bursaries can be taken in one of the following formats:

- Contribution towards UCFB preferred partner accommodation*
- Contribution towards the cost of travel from term time address to campus for one year
- Tuition fee reduction (only for applicants not eligible to receive a tuition fee loan)


