Reflection

Gospel Focus

John 3:16-18

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

but may have eternal life.

For God sent his Son into the world

not to condemn the world,

but so that through him the world might be saved.

No one who believes in him will be condemned;

but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already,

because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son.'

As we begin our new half term, last Sunday's Gospel reminds us of the greatest gift ever given: God's love for the world through His Son, Jesus. Jesus teaches that God the Father did not send Him to condemn the world, but to save it and bring hope and eternal life to all who believe in Him.
