What will school be like when I return in September 2020?

In September, each year group will have its own corridor which all lessons will take place. For example you may only be on the F corridor for every lesson.


For example: P1 could be Maths in F12 and P2 could be Geography in F15. You will not have any lessons on any other corridor.

Year group "bubbles"

You may have heard the word "bubbles" used a lot recently. All this means is the group you stay inside and do not mix with others.






Why are we in bubbles?

Let's imagine a student in Year 11 becomes unwell, if they are in a Bubble, the steps we may have to take to look after everyone will only affect one year group. The rest of us will be able to continue coming to school.
