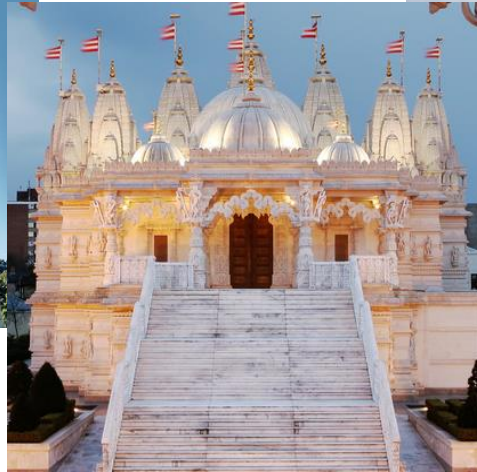
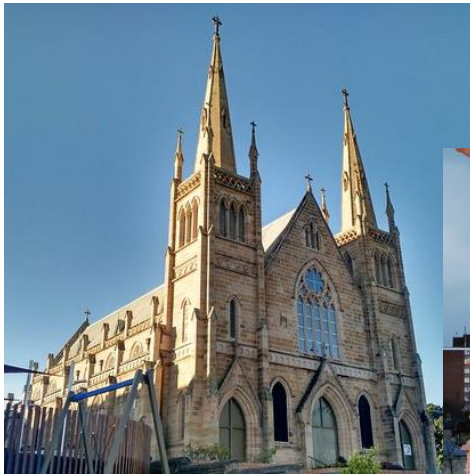
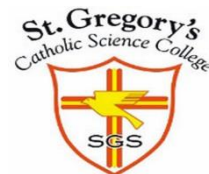

Task 1... Religious Detectives!



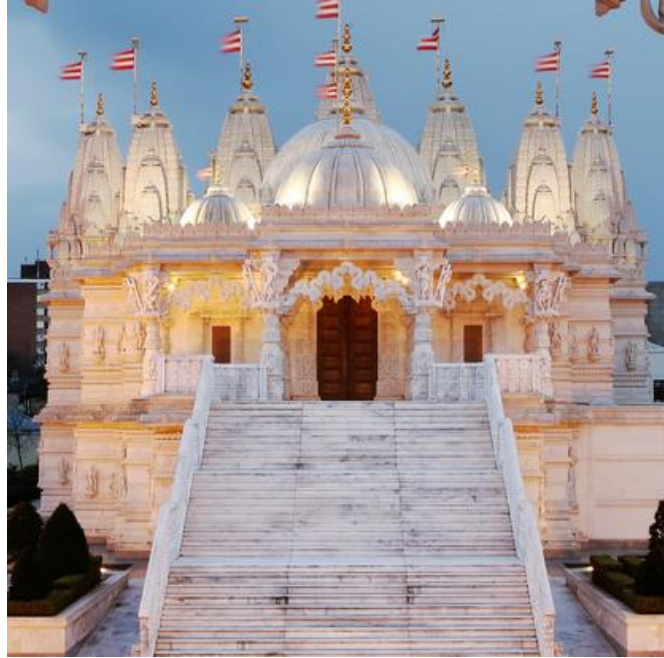

What can you remember about the religious Artefacts mentioned in the clips? For each artefact say what it is, what it is used for and what religion it belongs to









CHRISTIAN ARTEFACTS

| | |

| BREAD & WINE  <p>Christians drink wine from a chalice, and eat bread, remembering Jesus's body and blood.</p> | CROSS  <p>The symbol of the Cross reminds Christians of how Jesus died for us and of his resurrection.</p> |
| CANDLES  <p>Candles are lit by Christians when they pray to remind them that Jesus said he was the Light of The World!</p> | THE BIBLE  <p>The Bible is found in every church and is the most important book for Christians.</p> |
| ALTAR  <p>Bread, wine and candles are placed on the altar, a holy table where communion is celebrated.</p> | HYMN PRAYER BOOKS  <p>Hymn Books and Prayer Books are used by Christians in worship.</p> |









ISLAMIC ARTEFACTS

| CRESCENT MOON  <p>Followers of Islam are guided through life as the stars and moon guide travellers across the desert.</p> | THE QUR'AN  <p>The most sacred book of Muslims. It contains the words of Allah revealed to Muhammad.</p> |
| MUSALLA - PRAYER MAT  <p>Gives a clean surface on which to pray. It is always laid down facing Makkah.</p> | SUBHA - PRAYER BEADS  <p>Ninety-nine beads are used to praise God's names. The largest bead is for Allah.</p> |
| TOPI  <p>Muslims may cover their heads before praying. A Topi is part of traditional Arab clothing.</p> | MINARET  <p>The tower of a mosque from which the call to prayer is made.</p> |

HINDU ARTEFACTS

| HOLY BOOKS  <p>There are written in Sanskrit and treated with great respect.</p> | PRAYER BEADS  <p>108 Mala prayer beads may be used to focus on the names of Gods.</p> |
| MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS  <p>Instruments are often used in Hindu worship.</p> | ARTI LAMP  <p>This is moved in front of the shrine. The five flames symbolise the five elements.</p> |
| COCOONUT  <p>A symbol of fertility also given as a sign of good luck.</p> | KARBI  <p>A girl ties a karbi bracelet around her brother's wrist for protection.</p> |
| SACRED THREAD  <p>Blessed by a priest and worn by boys to remind them of their duties.</p> | GARLANDS  <p>Used to decorate a shrine. Also worn at weddings and by the dead at cremation.</p> |

| TALLETH  <p>A prayer shawl.</p> | KIPPAH  <p>Male prayer cap.</p> |
| MEZUZAH  <p>Seven-branched candlestick.</p> | YAD  <p>Pointer used when reading the Torah scroll.</p> |
| MEZUZAH  <p>A sacred scroll inscribed with prayers from the Torah.</p> | STAR OF DAVID  <p>The symbol of Judaism.</p> |
| TORAH  <p>Read in the Synagogue. It is the first five books of the Hebrew Bible.</p> | DREIDEL  <p>A dreidel is a four-sided top used in a game played during Chanukah.</p> |
